

This document sets out the Resource Productivity and Recovery Authority's (RPRA) 2024 Fees for the Hazardous Waste Program (HWP) Registry and the RPRA HazTrack mobile app. These are fees that generators of hazardous waste pay to cover RPRA's costs for building, maintaining, and operating the HWP Registry and RPRA HazTrack mobile app and for providing support to registry users.

<u>Regulation 347: General – Waste Management</u> under the <u>Environmental Protection Act</u> requires generators, carriers and receivers of hazardous waste to report information through the HWP Registry. The <u>Subject Waste Program Regulation</u> under the <u>Resource Recovery</u> <u>and Circular Economy Act, 2016 (RRCEA)</u> maintains the fee exemptions for certain wastes and facilities that currently exist under Regulation 347.

The 2024 fee rates below do not include HST. HST will be collected on the 2024 fees when they are invoiced.

2024 Hazardous Waste Program Registry Fees

Description	Fee
Hazardous waste *Excludes waste subject to tonnage fee exemptions in the Subject Waste Program Regulation under the RRCEA	\$30 / tonne
Manifest *Excludes manifests for waste subject to manifest fee exemptions in the Subject Waste Program Regulation under the RRCEA	\$6 / manifest

Hazardous Waste generators are responsible for paying fees to RPRA.

Rates are subject to HST.

Fee payment timeline

Fees for shipments will be automatically calculated when manifests are completed on the registry or the RPRA HazTrack mobile app. Invoices will be issued monthly. Fees are due based on the terms of the invoice.

Fees for onsite disposal will be automatically calculated and an invoice will be issued when the onsite report is completed. Fees are due based on the terms of the invoice.

Other charges and fees

RPRA may levy a monthly 1.5% administrative charge on late payments.

Review timeline

Fees will be reviewed again for 2025 to ensure they reflect the information available at that time.
